Thursday 06.06.2024 Mind and body are one Language in forms of the embryo

Two points of view (observer vs. Participant), two realities: primary and secondary. Non-duality and twofoldness. From Descartes' dualism to holism. Where do I come from? NOT from a cell. Matter & spirit: polarity or duality? Two bodies: first and third person. Phenomenology: understanding (gestures, sense) versus explanation (causality). Mind and Body in the womb? Man is Mind, Movement Matter. Form < movement < gesture < act. What do we do as an embryo? The body as a process: autopoiesis. Gestures of growth as human behavior and expression.

To exist as embryo? Autopoiesis Born to Be From There to Here

The 'body-forming' soul, expressing itself in forms & Gestalt. Autopoiesis and 'performance'. The body emerges from us, not the other way around. Homology: yet-not-human? Craniocaudal gradient: form- and process-pole related to awareness and consciousness. Eightfold dimension of body and consciousness. The embryo within us. The zygote as the undivided body. Centripetal existence: from There to Here. Birth, grounding gesture of dying development: connection and separation. Birth as a soft landing?

Friday 07.06.2024

Living in Chaos & Cosmos. In the Beginning Polarity?

The Breath of Life between Chaos and Cosmos, Yin and Yang with in the Middle: Life, Health and Dialogue. Meden Agan: Death has two faces. Trinity (Threefoldness) of the animal body with the trunk as the "Middle. The lemniscate as the characteristic of 'the Middle' with being healthy and living as the balance. Dynamic morphology of human conception. Images of conception: making or getting? IVF and ICSI: Who makes whom pregnant? Coming together (coitus) or penetration? Phenomenology as a method of 'seeing' the 'invisible'. Dialogue as a biological principle.

Conception - Heaven and Earth? Out of the One the Two: Big Bang?

Distinguish duality and polarity with Steigerung as possibility in the middle. Sperm cellularity versus egg cellularity. PreConception Attraction Complex. Conception as Lemniscate and Still Point. Celestial & terrestrial forces. First week: the undivided body vs. 'cellularity'. The whole does not emerge from parts. Differentiation and organization (orchestration) as essences of embryonic development. Nesting: dialogue of letting go and binding. Blastula with center and periphery, posterior and anterior as first body orientations.

Saturday 08.06.2024 The vegetative embryo Interaction-Inner. Third dimension

First week is blastula pause: the 'time' is not there yet. Dying through nidation from the mineral to the vegetative 'plant-ness' of the second week. Ectoderm and endoderm: two fundamental ways of dealing with environment with the dimensions (gestures) of sympathy and antipathy. Tat tvam asi: still being "there". Twins as a phenomenon of the still undivided body. Inception of the "third week" Meso: fascia and blood as main manifestations of the mesenchyme as the dimension of the middle. From "growing out" to "growing in," living the animal way.

Animated (animal) embryo Embodiment and individuation

The incarnation of the heart: getting from there to here'. Craniocaudal body axis: the organization of the 'midline'. Head and tailbone, as well as left and right as polar body dimensions. The V of symmetry. The flexion folding in fourth week as dynamics of individuation and embodiment. 'Pre-exercise' of birth. The animate body with the dimensions of antipathy and sympathy. Neural tube and intestinal tube. Metamerism: the rhythmic segmentation of the middle. Dying from the vegetative into the animate.

Sunday 09.06.2024

The Psychosomatic Embryo The Human: a fourth way?

Polarity of external vs. internal movements and of the animal (somatic) vs. the vegetative (autonomic) nervous system. The hologram principle of trinity: polarity appears in all body dimensions. Neuro-/ pneumo-/ viscero-. Muscle as connective tissue: cycle, rhythm, vibration, 3types of muscle (movement). Germ layers are not 'anatomical' principles, more psycho-somatic dimensions. What about placenta? Reflection of macrocosm and microcosm in the our psycho-somatic organization. Balancing and centering as the fourth (human) principle: the upright posture.

The Shape of freedom and balance Man: Evolving Embryo

Polarity of arms vs. legs but also of head (skull) vs. limbs with the trunk in between as an image of freedom. Three pairs of limbs: arms mediate. Preserving the upright posture and embryonic features as an image of the essentially human quality of balance and preservation. Man and animal, an opposition? Man as 'mature embryo' ('retardation') and 'firstborn' (non-specialization). Phylogeny and ontogeny: plan or consequence? Evolution of mind? Where do we come from?

Activities: Body-motions and form drawing as phenomenological method: forms and gestures. "Anatomical dancing". Polarity and opposition.

Jaap van der Wal PhD MD is a physician and until his retirement in 2012 he worked as associate professor of Anatomy and Embryology at the University of Maastricht, the Netherlands.

After his medical training in 1973, he specialized in Functional Anatomy of the Postural and Musculoskeletal System with (later) emphasis on the architecture of connective tissue and fascia and its role in proprioception. Gradually, he developed as a teacher in the philosophy of science and in medical anthropology. "My passion, however, was and still is human embryology. The human body is a process that develops and functions over time. The embryo moves and behaves in forms. It is in this area that I came across Goethe's phenomenological approach. I apply the method of dynamic morphology to understand what we actually do as human beings when we are embryos. I respectfully find in the embryo tentative answers to questions about the SIGNIFICANC' of human existence."

After his retirement in 2012, he devotes himself entirely to Dynamension, a worldwide project to teach Embryosophy. Check out his website: www.embryo.nl. He now teaches his "Embryosophy" mainly in Europe and the US at trainings for Craniosacral therapy, osteopathy, polarities therapy but also the courses are open to prenatal psychologists and trauma therapists and S(omatic)E(experience) practitioners and so on. Inspired by Rudolf Steiner's anthroposophy, the courses, seminars and webinars are open to anyone who is in search of spirit AND body in man with an open mind: building bridges between science and spirituality.
